<p>Oil painting by Michele Felice Cornè, 1803</p>	
<p>To fire a gun required the sponge to put out any hot sparks inside the barrel of a cannon. In case of misfire, the shot was allowed to roll out and the worm was used to pull out the powder bag, a dangerous job if the gun was hot.</p>	
<p>30-minute sand glass, used to time the watch</p>	
<p>Horsing iron, used by shipwright to drive oakum between planks to make the ship watertight</p>	
<p>Fore-and-aft hat, worn by the captain and lieutenants</p>	<p>US Navy/USS Constitution Museum, Boston</p>
<p>Map of the Mediterranean Sea</p>	
<p>Scuttlebutt, cask which held the drinking water for the crew</p>
